FEES / INVOICING:

1. The general international contracted course fee for is listed below:

The Jones Institute will make every effort to work together with a host to negotiate the best and most beneficial financial arrangement for both parties.

2. Non-Refundable Deposit:

A non-refundable U.S. Dollar \$1,500.00 deposit **per course(s) or trip** is required and payment must be received by the Jones Institute before contract dates are secured. The paid deposit amount will be deducted from the final invoice issued at the end of the course(s).

3. Final Invoicing:

Upon completion of the course(s) trip the Jones Institute will invoice the Contracting Host for the course fee(s) and expenses outlined in the Contracting Host section below less the deposit amount paid. The final invoice will be due Net 30 days from the last day of the course(s). All monies due will be paid in U.S. Dollars to the Jones Institute.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Jones Institute:

- Will provide qualified Instructors, Lab Assistants and/or Table Trainers accordingly.
- Will make reasonable travel arrangements for instructors or assistants as required.
- Will provide each attendee with a course Syllabus, free Flip Chart (One Flip Chart at the SCS I and III courses, and 2 Flip Charts at the SCS II course) and a Certificate of Completion.
- Will provide a written course description, detailed time schedule and list of goals and objectives of the course.
- Will provide a resume of Instructor for promotion purposes/inquiries-on request.
- Will provide whatever assistance they can to the Contracting Host Facility.

Contracting Host Facility:

- All course administration preparation: advertising, processing course registrations and, collecting registration fees.
- Instruction is given in English (American). If a translator is required you will need to provide them for the entire course. Also, you will need to make prior arrangements with Jones Institute, up to 4-6 months in advance of the course to have the course syllabus and any pre-course reading material translated into the language of your Country.
- All course expenses as they apply:
 1. Food and beverage supplied. Food/Beverage recommendation and schedule will be supplied.
 2. Shipment of course materials to course location. (Shipped UPS/USPS. To be billed on final invoice.)
 3. Travel expenses for Jones Institute instructors and assistants working the course i.e. airfare, hotel, car rental, meals, parking, mileage and/or transportation fees, and any reasonably incurred traveling expense relative to the course. (To be billed on the final invoice of completion of the course.)
- Apply for any/all Continuing Educational requirements in your Country. (Course goals and objectives sheet provided to Contracting Host facility.)
- Provide the Jones Institute with a final and complete list of participants three weeks before the course. (The Agreement will outline specifics of information required per participant.)
- Provide AV equipment as needed: A PowerPoint projector with standby computer and a screen.
NOTE: All SCS courses are given using Powerpoint.
- IF AVAILABLE (not absolutely necessary; nice to have) – Skeletal Piece(s):
*For SCS I course: flexible spine with pelvis *For SCS II: a skeleton *For SCS III: a Cranial skeletal piece
- Provide a location suitable to hold a three-day lab course for attendees with 2-3 people working at each treatment table. To include treatment tables with appropriate sheets and/or padding. (Prefer 2 to a table.)
- Provide participants with break food and beverage during the course. (Break food and beverage recommendations provided later.)
- Provide the Jones Institute with any special site/travel/local information such as facility map-internal/external with directives, parking (map), new/current construction or detours, etc. that may be relative to the travel.
- Provide the Jones Institute with:

 - Post/Mailing Address
 - Contact Info: Contact First and Last name, phone number and email address

COURSES SUMMARY:

- The Jones Institute Strain Counterstrain courses are generally three-day courses held Friday through Sunday. However, the course schedule can be customized. The time frame must include 20 hours of course time.
- The contracting company may choose a course from our Strain Counterstrain series or create a custom course based on certain areas of interest upon Jones Institute approval. The standard Strain Counterstrain course series consists of the following:

SCS I	for the Spine	Techniques for cervical, thoracic, ribs, lumbar, sacrum & pelvis.	None
SCS II	for the Extremities	Techniques for pelvis, hip, knee, ankle, foot, shoulder, elbow, wrist & hand.	None
SCS III	Cranial & Advanced Techniques	Cranial evaluation & treatment with 40 new cervical, thoracic, lumbar and extremity techniques.	I or II
SCS IV	Facilitated SCS with Review	Facilitated techniques to drop the hold time to 15 seconds for all SCS techniques. Treatment strategies for chronic pain patients.	I, II & III
FCS FI	SCS - Fascial Introduction	This class, which acts as the pre-requisite course for the recently developed FCS series, will provide students with approximately 10 of the most powerful techniques from each class in the Fascial series: SCS VC-Viscera, SCS AR-Arterial System, SCS LV-Lymphatic-Venous, SCS N1-Nervous System, Part 1 and the future SCS Ligamentous-Capsular courses. FCS VC	SCS for the Viscera	Over 65, newly developed techniques that alleviate abnormal soft tissue tension in the peritoneal cavity, pelvic cavity, thorax, visceral vascular system and associated fascia.	SCS I, II OR FCS FI
FCS LV	SCS for the Lymphatic-Venous	Explores the newly discovered entity of lymphatic dysfunction. This condition, identified by the presence of lymphatic tender points, is essentially a vasospasm of the large lymphatic vessels of the body. FCS AR	SCS for the Arterial System	Over 75 newly discovered techniques that directly affect the vascular fascia or "tunica adventitia".	SCS I, II OR FCS FI
FCS N1	SCS for the Nervous System, Part 1	FCS N1 explores the newly discovered entity of neuro-fascial dysfunction focusing on the nerves of the cervicothoracic spine, upper extremities and cranium.	SCS I, II OR FCS FI
FCS N2	SCS for the Nervous System, Part 2	FCS N2 is the continuation of the neuro-fascial treatment concept from SCS N1 with the focus now placed on the structures below the diaphragm.	SCS N1
FCS MS1	SCS for the Musculoskeletal System, Part 1	MS1 explores specific aspects of musculoskeletal dysfunction including "Myo-chains" and spinal ligament dysfunctions.	SCS I, II or FCS FI
